4. Keep hands, feet, and ugly words to self.	 Use encouraging words for your teammates. Avoid criticizing players, coaches, parents, and officials, especially during a game. 	
5. Walk and talk quietly.	 Except when you're cheering in the stands! End your competitions with a handshake or high five.

Eligibility Rules for Athletes

Attendance:

Students who are present during the school day are expected to be present at practice. Absence from practice is excused when a student is absent from school or when a parent contacts the office to excuse absence from practice.

Unexcused absences from practice will result in the following:

1 unexcused absence	Miss one half of next competition.
2 unexcused absences	Miss next competition.
3 unexcused absences	Dismissed from team.

Behavior:

Our school-wide expectations and rules are in full force when we take part in any school sponsored event, whether it is at Mar Lee School or another school. Athletes who do not follow our school-wide expectations will receive a Report for Broken Rule. They will receive the appropriate consequence on the Mar Lee Behavior matrix, as well as the following:

Incident 1	Miss one half of next competition.	
Incident 2	Miss next competition.	
Incident 3	Dismissed from team.	

Academic:

Athletes must be <u>passing all classes</u> in order to participate in competition. If an athlete is failing any class (earning an E) they will not be allowed to compete, but may continue to attend practices. Students earning two or more E grades must sit out of practice until they are failing one or fewer classes.

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Play time is not guaranteed. Players who come to practice to play basketball and work hard will earn play time regardless of skill level.

Athletes will receive written notification if they will miss playing time due to unexcused absences, academic ineligibility, write ups, or low effort. Athletes are responsible for notifying their parents of their change in playing time.
